

THELWALL HERITAGE SIGNAGE TRAIL

START

With the Parish Hall behind you, cross to far right of the car park to see the THELWALL 1100 COMMEMORATIVE STONE.

The plinth contains a time capsule with memorabilia from the 1923 and 2023 celebrations.

No coins or materials of value are held inside.

THE TERRACE TO LASKEY LANE

Take the sloping track to your right before Baden Lodge to The Terrace.

Turn right along the path to a gate to Laskey Farm fields.

Cross, veering right to the stone wall and gate into Laskey Lane. Turn right towards Lymm Road for the LASKEY LANE wall plaque.

The Laskey Lane wall plaque explains the importance of this route to fields, fisheries and Stanton's Gunpowder Works before the Manchester Ship Canal.

GREENFIELD HOUSE (Chaigeley)

Turn right onto Lymm Road for the plaque on the gate pillar to Chaigeley explaining the history and ownership of Greenfield House.

Greenfield built in 1775 for John Stanton

THE WAR MEMORIAL

Follow Lymm Road towards the War Memorial - the legacy of Thelwall's Millenary Celebrations in 1923 and dedicated in 1925. CROSS LYMM LANE WITH GREAT CARE INTO BELL LANE ON YOUR LEFT.

THELWALL RAILWAY STATION

Proceed up Bell Lane to Stockport Road and CROSS WITH CARE INTO HALFACRE LANE. Take the steps up to the Transpennine Trail.

To your right is the Thelwall Station information board and behind, its last remnant - the Ticket Office.

THELWALL HALL

Turn left (west) on the TPT to a path taking you right over a bridge, down to Stockport Road. CROSS WITH CARE INTO ALL SAINTS DRIVE. Straight on, turning right into Parry Drive and Elizabeth Park with its information board on Thelwall Hall.

ALL SAINTS' CHURCH

Retrace your steps to turn right down All Saints Drive to the church at the end of the road.

To the left of the lytchgate, a plaque gives a brief history of the manorial chapel and the present building.

THELWALL FERRY

Turn right at the bottom of All Saints Drive onto Thelwall New Road and take the next turn left into Ferry Lane. Proceed to the Manchester Ship Canal and the Thelwall Ferry.

THE PICKERING ARMS

Retrace your steps to the main road note the inscription on the gable end of the Pickering Arms opposite. CROSS WITH CARE to see the plaque on display inside.

RETURN TO PARISH HALL via path to the Terrace past old Thelwall Post Office.

A circular trail of about 2 miles on footpaths, roads and parkland taking about 1 hour to complete. The trail can be muddy and uneven at certain times of year, so appropriate footwear is strongly advised.

N.B. Blue plaques have been made for Thelwall Ferry and The Pickering Arms but could still be awaiting permissions to display them.
